2. Venue

Event centre and accommodation are located in Eugendorf, 10 km north east of Salzburg city. The competition areas are situated 15 to 50 kms from the event centre, 700 – 1.400 m above sea level.

3. Embargoed Areas

All cross country areas of Thalgau, Faistenau, Abtenau and Strobl-Postalm.

4. Programme, Dates and types of competitions

Sunday, 11th February	Arrival of the teams
Monday, 12th February	Model event JWOC: Sprint Opening ceremony
Tuesday, 13th February	JWOC & EYOC: Middle distance
Wednesday, 14th February	Rest day
Thursday, 15th February	JWOC & EYOC: Long Distance
Friday, 16th February	JWOC Relay Closing Party, Banquet
Saturday, 17th February	Departure of the teams

5. Classes and participation restrictions

JWOC (W 20, M 20)

According to IOF rules, each federation may enter a team of 14 competitors – up to 7 women and 7 men and unlimited number of team officials. In each competition each federation may enter:

- individual events max. 6 women, 6 men
- relay event max. 2 female teams, 2 male teams

EYOC (W 17, M 17)

According EYOC special rules, in each competition each federation may enter:

- individual events max. 4 women, 4 men
- unofficial sprint and relay event (Special AOF Prize)

Insurance

Competitors participate at their own risk. According to national regulations, insurance against accidents shall be upon the responsibility of their national federation or themselves.

6. Terrain Type

- Sprint Distance:** mostly open area with smooth hills and scattered forest, about 780 m above sea level
- Middle Distance:** mostly flat but varying area with few steep passages, 70 % open area, about 700 m above sea level
- Long Distance and Relay:** typical alpine character terrain, mostly open area with scattered forest, 1.100 to 1.400 m above sea level

7. Visas

For countries who need a visa for visiting Austria: please send complete visa application forms to the organizer by December 1st 2006

8. Registration

Preliminary entry for teams who want to participate: team leaders please fill out the preliminary entry form before 15th November 2006

Final entry: last day for final entry with names of the competitors and team officials is 29th January 2007
The entry forms will be downloadable from the website www.ski-jwoc2007.eu from 10th October.

9. Accommodation

There will be 3 types of accommodation A, B and C categories. All hotels provide rooms with 2-4 beds, shower within the rooms. Distance will be up to 5 km from the event centre.

10. Maps, scales

- Maps:** All competitions will be in newly mapped areas
- Scale:** For sprint 1 : 5.000
For long, middle distance and relay 1 : 10.000
Vertical contour line intervals: 5 m

11. Punching system

SportIdent is used as electronic punching system.
Competitors may use either their own SI card or they can borrow one from the organizer.

12. Media services

Media centre is located in the event centre and provides all media representatives with internet, fax and copy services.

13. How to get to Salzburg and the event centre

- By car:** Highway A1 exit Wallersee, then direction to Henndorf or follow the signs
Please note that for Austrian highways a vignette is obligatory! We recommend a 10 day ticket for cars < 3,5t (7,60) – it can be purchased when crossing the border (see the signs).

14. Transport

On request it may be possible to arrange transport from the Salzburg airport or railway station to the event centre for free. All other transport can be organized for an additional transport fee.
Private transport to the competition areas is allowed.
